PECHA 2010 Circuit Awards

PECHA Circuit High Score Awards will be awarded in every division through 4th place. Points to be accumulated 10-6-4-2-1-1/2. The 2010 PECHA Circuit consists of 8 horse shows. In order to be eligible for a PECHA Circuit Championship a rider must participate in the division in four of the horse shows to be eligible for a high score award. In order for a division to be eligible for circuit awards it must have been held at a minimum of four of the shows. Classes must have three entries to be counted for show championships and circuit awards. Shows, may at the discretion of management, hold classes with less than three entries.

PECHA High Score Awards to be presented at the August 18, 2010 Halcyon Summer Series Finale at the conclusion of each division.

PECHA MERIT AWARDS FOR EXCELLENCE

Horsemanship Merit Awards as well as Sportsmanship Merit Awards to be presented at each horse show at the discretion of the judge or show management for riders showing excellent grooming, turnout, horsemanship or sportsmanship in their opinion.

PECHA Trainer Incentive

The leading trainer for the circuit will receive a cash award of \$100.00 at the final show. The award will be based on total points earned by students during the circuit.

A Note For Parents:

Please read the Sportsmanship Pledge with your children and have them sign it and hand it in with your entry.

Children participate in riding because it is fun. Adults need to keep it fun. Some adults get too emotional about youth sports because they are too concerned about how their kids are doing, have the mistaken belief that winning is very important or have a desire for glory through their kid's success. That last one is part of the concept of living through your kids.

Children need to know that if they are trying their best, they are winners. Parents need to remember that their kids will not be great at everything. Recognizing that, parents can help most by relaxing and enjoying these fleeting years.

Placing too much pressure on children to perform well creates stress that can detract from their fun and can affect their self-esteem. Instructions shouted at riders are distracting, usually too late, and sometimes inaccurate or in conflict with what the trainer is teaching.

Parents need to control their negative emotions and acknowledge that failing to show respect for people who are doing the best they can sets a bad example for their children.

PECHA Young Rider Medal

Riders to be judged on hands, seat and control of mount over a course and then all riders who completed the course will be asked to return for a flat phase and possible further testing. The top 20 riders will qualify for the PECHA Young Rider Medal Finals to be held August 18, 2010 at the Halcyon Summer Series Finale show. Points throughout the series to be awarded for this class as follows: 1st-10, 2nd-6, 3rd-4, 4th-2, 5th-1, 6th-1/2. On the day of the finals there will be no schooling prior to this class and the flat phase will be conducted first.

Baby Green Hunter

Open to horses and ponies six years of age and under in their first two years of showing. Only professional and advanced riders over the age of 18 permitted to compete in this division nor the schooling session prior to the division as it is specifically for young horses whose behavior can at times be unpredictable. Fences 2'-2'3" and corners may be trotted without penalty and course will not contain any oxers.

1. All hunter classes will be judged on performance and soundness with emphasis on manners.
2. Show management and property owners will not be responsible for any accident, loss, or damage which may occur to any horse rider, or equipment before, during, or after the show.
3. The show committees reserve the right to cancel or combine any classes or schooling deemed necessary.
4. SHOW MANAGEMENT RESERVES THE RIGHT TO DECLINE TO RECEIVE ANY ENTRY, OR TO RETURN ANY ENTRY FEES BEFORE OR DURING THE SHOW WITHOUT BEING LIABLE FOR DAMAGES. EXHIBITORS ARE NOTIFIED THAT ANY ACT OF DISCOURTESY OR DISOBEDIENCE TO JUDGES OR OFFICIALS ON THE PART OF THE OWNER, RIDER, TRAINER OR GROOM SHALL DISQUALIFY THE ENTRY AND THE OWNER SHALL FORFEIT ALL FEES PAID. IN ADDITION, NO ACT OF ANIMAL CRUELTY OR POOR SPORTSMANSHIP WILL BE TOLERATED.
5. All riders must wear proper headgear and footwear at all times while mounted on the show grounds.
6. Championships will be awarded at the conclusion of the division in the show office.
7. No dogs allowed on grounds.
8. It is a condition of entry that these rules and regulations be read, understood, and accepted.
9. Except where specifically prohibited, cross entering is permitted and encouraged.
10. Pre-entries are greatly appreciated but there are no office fees, no scratch fees, no grounds fees at any PECHA show.
11. Entry Fee: \$15.00/class. All fees must be paid and entry blanks completed with all required signatures before numbers will be issued.

Halcyon Farm, Ltd. Directions:

FROM THE PENNSYLVANIA TURNPIKE: Exit 236, Take Rt. 15 South 9.6 miles. Turn left on Franklin Church Rd. Go 1.6 miles, turn left on Franklinton Rd. Go 1/4 mile and bear right on Locust Grove Rd. Halcyon Farm is 3/4 mile on the right.

FROM YORK: From Route 30, take Rt. 74 North for 3 miles. At Walgreen's turn left on Davidsburg Rd. (McDonald's on the right). Go 6.8 miles to stop sign at Rt. 194, turn right on 194, go 5 miles and turn left on State Game Rd. At the "T" turn right, then take the first left. Go up the hill to Halcyon Farm on the left as you start down the hill.

FROM MARYLAND/VIRGINIA: Rt. 15 north past York Springs exit (Rt. 94). Continue approx. 5 more miles on 15 north, turn right on Franklin Church Rd. Follow 'Turnpike' directions above.

FROM THE PENNSYLVANIA TURNPIKE: Take Exit 226 (old Exit 16) to Route 11 North, to 81 South, take Exit 47A (old Exit 14E) onto Route 34 South. Go approximately 4 miles to second light. Turn left at light onto Mill Street (Sheetz gas station on corner). Go approximately 1 mile to left onto Zion Road. Farm 1/2 mile on left.

FROM MARYLAND ON ROUTE 81 NORTH: Take Exit 47A (old Exit 14E) onto Route 34 South. Go approximately 4 miles to second light. Turn left on Mill Street (Sheetz gas station on corner). Go approximately 1 mile to left onto Zion Road. Farm 1/2 mile on left.

FROM MARYLAND ON ROUTE 15 NORTH: Take York Springs exit, bear right off ramp. Follow Route 94 approximately 8 miles to Mt. Holly Springs. At second light, turn right on Mill Street (Sheetz gas station on corner). Go approximately 1 mile to left onto Zion Road. Farm 1/2 mile on left.

FROM DILLSBURG: Rt. 74 North approximately 5 miles to light at 174. Turn left on 174, go about 2.5 miles to four-way stop. Turn left at four-way stop, go 3.2 miles to Zion Road on right. Turn right onto Zion Road. Farm 1/2 mile on left.

SECTION II: RELEASE AGREEMENT AND WAIVER

A. SECTION I: WARNINGS AND ASSUMPTION OF RISK AGREEMENT

A. I/WVE understand that horseback riding is classified as ADVENTURE RECREATIONAL SPORT ACTIVITY and that there are inherent elements of risk always present in any such activity despite all safety precautions. I fully assume the risk of personal injury arising from equine activities pursuant to Pennsylvania law some examples of risks I assume include but are not limited to the following:

1. Despite the fact that Halcyon Farm, Ltd. follows a rigid safety program, it is not possible for any person or establishment to predict exactly how a horse will behave when it is frightened, angry, or under stress. It may react according to its natural instincts which are to jump sideways, forward or backward, to run away from danger at trot or gallop, to kick with its hind legs, to strike with its forelegs, to buck, to rear up in front, to bite and/or throw its head upward or sideways.
 2. Upon mounting a horse and taking up the reins the rider is in primary control of the horse and his safety will depend largely upon his or her own ability to remain balanced at all times while aboard the horse or even while on the ground. If a rider falls from a horse to the ground it will be a fall from 31/2 to 5 feet and impact will be according to physical law, possibly resulting in injury to a rider.
 3. Halcyon Farm, Ltd. is not responsible for acts or occurrences of nature that can scare a horse or cause it to fall. Examples of such acts or occurrences of nature are: Thunder, lightning, rain, wind, water; wild and domestic animals, insects, reptiles, etc., which may run or fly near or bite a horse or person; and irregular footing on out-of-door groomed or wild land which is subject to constant change in condition according to weather conditions.
 4. For the safety of all riders and horses and pedestrians I/WVE must not carry loose items on rides which may fall, blow away, flap in the wind and possibly scare a horse; such examples being coolers, rain sheets, hats not securely fastened under chin, toys, and clothes not actually worn which are not securely tied on saddle or person, etc. Likewise I/WVE must not make sharp, loud noises, such as screaming which may scare a horse.
